400 year gap

CLOSE OF OLD TESTAMENT

Judea is under Persian rule, moderate oversight.

A descendant of King David, Zerrubabel was leader, though not formally powerful.

Temple modest, but rebuilt, Aaron's descendant the High Priest.

Old Testament in Hebrew primarily.

Center of worship, religious identity the Temple.

Teachers were prophets and scribes.

OPENING OF NEW TESTAMENT

Under Roman rule, tightly controlled.

A descendant of Esau, Herod the Great, was now King of the Jews.

Temple monumental, impressive, High Priest a political position.

Old Testament in Greek.

Center of worship, religious identity Temple and the Synagogue.

A variety of teachers, viewpoints including Pharisees, Sadducees, and Essenes.
